Giving and income





Key financial commentary

We are so grateful to God and you for what we have received. Thank you for your faithful generosity.

2022-23 has been a conservative financial year which we have finished positively. We have finished with surplus in our budget thanks to aggressively tightening spending in response to such a financially uncertain time in New Zealand.

We have recovered from our first year at a significant loss in 2021-22. We did this by using reserves to cover the shortfall and setting a conservative budget for 2022-23 accordingly to recover from the loss.

Our 2022-23 surplus will help us top-up our reserves and sow into the year ahead. We're restocking our savings with three-months of emergency funds for unforeseen reasons and using the rest towards our 2023-24 budget forecast.
